


# TALKING POINTS

*When Jesus Isn't Enough* by Monica Matthews

## Possible Questions for Interviewers for *When Jesus Isn't Enough*

### Opening Question:

- Your book title is intriguing—*When Jesus Isn't Enough*—are you a Christian and what do you mean by that title?
- What led you to write the book?
- Your book claims to be the Ultimate Meal for the Starving Single Woman. Why did you organize it around the metaphor of a meal?
- Your title suggests Jesus *isn't* enough sometimes, yet you talk about living a fulfilling and deeply satisfied life. Is it possible to feel complete as a person in Christ and still fail and not be perfect?
- You speak candidly in your book about women dealing with lust, addictions, and sexual desire. We tend to think of men as struggling with these issues more than woman, but what practical advice would you give the single Christian woman who's dealing with these temptations?
- Is your book intended only for single Christian woman?
- Give us the inside info: What do single women really expect from men and are they expecting too much?
- You talk a lot about freedom from bondage, but you suggest the chain women live with these days aren't physical as much as emotional and spiritual. What do you mean by that?
- What would you say to someone who says "Look, it just isn't possible to live a holy life in this sex-crazed culture we live in. That's expecting too much of a single woman"?
- You talk a lot about celebrating yourself in the book. Can you explain what you mean by that and why you think it is so important?

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
- In what ways do you think women today settle for scraps instead of enjoying the ultimate, satisfying “meal”?

2. Give a practical take-away, an easy win for listeners. Something they can do to improve their lives.
